# **Show Rules**

- 1. Only 1 entry in each class with the exception of roses, where another family member may also enter in the same class.
- 2. All entries in class 1-72 must be grown by the exhibitor for at least 60 days prior to the show.
- 3. Entries will be received at Lambeth United Church the evening prior to the show (Friday, June 14) between 6 & 8 pm and the morning of the show (Sat. June 15) from 7am-8:30 am. <u>ALL ENTRIES MUST BE IN PLACE FOR JUDGING BY 9:00AM. JUDGING BEGINS AT 9:30 AM SHARP.</u>
- 4. Entries must remain on display until the conclusion of the Awards Presentation.
- 5. Exhibitors must complete their own Entry Tags and fasten them to their entry.

- 6. Judging will be according to Ontario Judging Standards for Horticulture and Floral Design Publication 34 (2003).
- 7. The decision of judges will be <u>final</u>. Judges may withhold an award if, in their opinion, it is not warranted.
- 8. In classes 1-72: judges may divide the class, if the number of entries warrants such action.
- 9. All reasonable precautions will be taken to safeguard exhibits and containers, but the Society cannot be held responsible for damage to persons or property.
- 10. Entry tags will be available at the May 13<sup>th</sup> meeting to allow entrants to prepare tags in advance.
- 11. If in doubt about any rule, please contact the Show Conveners for Sections A to K or the Design Convenors for Section L.
- 12. Prize money will be available by 5 pm

# **Show Rules and Suggestions**

# **Roses: Classes 1-52b**

- 1.Specimen (Single) blooms should be one-half to threequarters open at the time of judging. A bloom in Sections A and E should have a well-formed centre with petals symmetrically arranged. No side buds.
- **2**. Sprays (Section B, BB,C,F,G & H) should have a cluster of flowers characteristic of the cultivar. Some flowers may be fully open and others only partly. Form should be graceful and symmetrical.
- **3**. All roses, (except miniatures) should have at least 10" but not over 20" stem.
- **4**. Climbing miniatures should be entered as miniatures (Section D) not as Climbers.
- **5.** Containers are supplied for Classes 1-50 and 52b.
- **6.** ALL roses should be named if possible. Advice is available.
- **7.** Any rose from Section A-H inclusive is eligible for Best Rose in The Show.
- **8**. If you are a first time rose entrant please mark your entry tags "Novice".

#### **Section I: One Rose**

Floated in exhibitor's own rose bowl or other suitable container. If greenery is used, a set of 2 or 3 leaves is the maximum. A leaf consists of 5-7 leaflets. Cl 51 Any colour.

#### **Section J: Specimen Roses**

Specimen blooms, not necessarily one cultivar, any colour or colours

Cl 52a Five hybrid tea roses in exhibitor's own container Cl 52b Six miniature roses, to be shown in palette supplied.

# Section L: Design Classes Theme: "Back to the Farm"

# PRE-REGISTRATION IS NECESSARY for Classes 73-79.

Deadline for registration is **Friday, June 10<sup>th</sup>**, in order to guarantee a space. Call Ruth: 519-652-5188 or Sheila 519-672-6475. Entries must be in place ready for judging by 9 a.m. the day of the show. Entries may also be placed June 14. between 6-8 p.m.

Accessories may be used if you wish. Artificial plant material is not permitted. Entries must be completely within the confines of space allowed. Mini and Small arrangements must be to proper scale.

Cl 73 **Room to Grow...** A traditional mass to be shown before a black background. A design with a large quantity of plant material arranged in a closed silhouette with few or no voids. Space allowed: 28"w. x 30"d. x 28"h.

Cl 74 **Green Acres:** A Foliage design

Foliage is to predominate. Flowers and/or fruits may be included but must be inconspicuous. To be shown on table 20" sq. with white overlay.

- Cl 75 **Country Wedding:** A design in a basket. To include some roses
- Cl 76 The Farm Gate: A design to include garden produce
- Cl 77 A Rustic Pair: A design using two containers.
- Cl 78 **Down by the Pond:** A water viewing design. Usually a line design in a shallow container with one-half to two-thirds of the container surface showing water.
- Cl 79 **The Barn Quilt Trail:** A Pave design A design placing groups of plant material that has been cut very short, close together to form undulating mounds of colour, textures, shapes and sizes. Any plant material can be used foliage, fruit, flowers, moss, stems, vegetables.

Space allowed for classes 75, 76,77, 78 & 79 is 28"w x 30"d x 36"h

- Cl 80 **Earth Matters:** A round or rectangular planter (with plants in or out of pots). Not to exceed 18" in diameter or 3' in length.
- Cl 81 **Baby Chicks:** A small design, not to exceed 10" in any direction.
- Cl 82 **A Drop in the Bucket:** a miniature design, not to exceed 5" in any direction.

# Children's Corner

A Dish Garden ... a mini landscape in an open shallow container, not larger than 8" in diameter. Plants should have similar culutral requirements. May include accessories to scale.

- Cl 82 Children 6 to 8 yrs. of age
- Cl 83 Children 8 to 12 yrs. of age
