# Section D: Micro & Miniature & Climbing Miniatures:

# <u>1 spray (no longer than 6" in length)</u>

Any colour. Semi-double or double (over 13 petals)

- Cl 38 Yellows
- Cl 39 Pinks
- Cl 40 Reds
- Cl 41 Any other colour

# Section H: Modern Shrub Roses introduced

since 1915 – except Kordesii Climbers and Austin Roses

(1 spray or 1 branch, 15" or less)

Cl 42 Single and near single (13 petals or less) any colour

Cl 43 Semi-double or double (over 13 petals) any colour

### Section I: One Rose

Floated in exhibitor's own rose bowl or other suitable container. If greenery is used, a set of 2 or 3 leaves is the maximum. A leaf consists of 5-7 leaflets. Cl 44 Any colour.

### **Section J: Specimen Roses**

Specimen blooms, not necessarily one cultivar, any colour or colours

Cl 45a Five hybrid tea roses in exhibitor's own container

Cl 45b Six miniature roses, to be shown in palette supplied.

- Cl 47 Sweet William 3 stems
- Cl 48 Lily (Lilium) 1 stem

- Cl 52 Peony 1 bloom (disbudded)

Cl 63 Pansies – not more than 7 blooms in exhibitor's own container.

Cl 64 Collection of garden flowers, min. of 3 kinds in exhibitor's own container.

Cl 65 Hosta Leaves – 2 large different cultivars, in exhibitor's own container.

Cl 66 1986 – *Beauty of Summer*: A Planter Maximum 18" diameter (inside dimension). Cl 67 A Specimen Foliage Plant. Pot not to exceed 10" inside dimension. Page 26 \*OJES

- Cl 68 2003 *Heavenly Days:* A satellite design. A design of the same colour, form or texture at it's base, having a connecting line that becomes an integral part of it's rhythmic pattern. Table space 28"w x 30"d x 36" h. Neutral Background
- Cl 69 2001 *Canada Summer Games:* An underwater design. A design with part(s) placed under water to create interest. Table space 28"w x 30"d X 36" h Neutral Background. Page 107, \*OJES.
- Cl 70 1980 *This is the Life:* An interpretive design. Table space 28"w x 30"d x 36"h. Neutral Background. Page 99, \*OJES.
- Cl 71 1988 *Come Into My Garden:* A design featuring weathered wood and or rock. Table space 30"w x 30"d x 36" h Neutral Background. Page 108, \*OJES.
- Cl 72 2015 *Sentimental Journey:* A traditional mass design. A design with a large quantity of plant material in a closed silhouette. Table space 30"w X 30"d x 36" h Black Background. Page 100 \*OJES.
- Cl 73 1984 *Garden Party:* A functional table setting for two, on a 30"square card table (supplied). Exhibitor to supply own tablecloth. Page 98, \*OJES
- Cl 74 1982 *Waltz of the Flowers:* A small design. Not over 10" in any direction. Page 104, \*OJES
- Cl 75 1996 *Floral Notes:* A miniature design. Must not exceed 5 inches in any direction. Page 101 \*OJES.

#### Show Rules & Suggestions

1. Only 1 entry in each class with the exception of roses, where another family member may also enter in the same class.

All entries in class 1-67 must be grown by the exhibitor for at least 60 days prior to the show.
Entries will be received at Lambeth United Church the evening prior to the show (Tuesday, June 16) between 6 & 8 pm and the morning of the show (Wednesday June 17) from 7:00 am - 9:00 am. <u>ALL ENTRIES MUST BE IN PLACE FOR JUDGING BY</u> 9:00 AM. JUDGING BEGINS AT 9:30 AM SHARP.

4. Entries must remain on display until the conclusion of the Awards Presentation.

5. Exhibitors must complete their own Entry Tags and fasten them to their entry.

6. Judging will be according to Ontario Judging Standards for Horticulture and Floral Design – Publication 34 (2010).

7. The decision of the judges will be <u>final</u>. Judges may withhold an award if, in their opinion, it is not warranted.

8. In classes 1-65: judges may divide the class, if the number of entries warrants such action.

9. All reasonable precautions will be taken to safeguard exhibits and containers, but the Society cannot be held responsible for damage to persons or property.

10. Entry tags will be available at the May 11<sup>th</sup> meeting to allow entrants to prepare tags in advance.

11. If in doubt about any rule, please contact the Show Conveners for Sections A to K or the Design Convenors for Section L.

12. Prize money will be available by 5 pm

#### Roses: Classes 1-45b

**1**.Specimen (Single) blooms should be one-half to threequarters open at the time of judging. A bloom in Sections A and E should have a well-formed centre with petals symmetrically arranged. No side buds.

**2**. Sprays (Section B, BB, C, F, G & H) should have a cluster of flowers characteristic of the cultivar. Some flowers may be fully open and others only partly. Form should be graceful and symmetrical.

**3**. All roses, (except miniatures) should have at least 10" but not over 20" stem.

4. Containers are supplied for Classes 1-43 and 45b.

**5.** ALL roses should be named if possible. Advice is available.

**6.** Any rose from Section A-H inclusive is eligible for Best Rose in The Show.

7. If you are a first time rose entrant please mark your entry tags <u>"Novice".</u>
